House Projects

Renovations on the house are going well! The BMA is nearly finished: drywall and paint were finished in last fall, and the floor was finished in June, so once the bunks are installed, it'll be finished (which is planned to be completed during Zero Week of this upcoming Fall term). The recent replacement the BMA and kitchen decks, along with the completion of the Addition siding (paint included), are a tremendous improvement of the house's appearance.

Some of the projects that are in the plans to be completed in the near future – hopefully before the 50th – are replacing the front fence (which is falling apart / rotting) with a new cedar split rail fence, installing trim throughout the house, and replacing the floor in the lower addition hallway. The retaining wall on the Century 21 side of the property has been slowly falling over, and the neighbor has had a contractor look at it, so hopefully this eyesore will be taken care of soon.

A few other projects that are on the to-do list include fixing the parking lot lights, re-staining/sealing the foyer staircase, extending the net around the volleyball court, resealing the parking lot, and replacing old/broken doors (especially exterior doors).

The renovation of the café is the basically the largest project left to call the renovations complete, and House Corps is diligently working on the plan of attack.
