Derby Days 2014

The last week of April in 2014 marked another successful Derby Days event for the Zeta Theta B chapter. Our chapter teamed up with the sororities at Kettering University, a team of independents and a team from Wayne State to raise money for the Huntsman Cancer Institute. It was a packed week full of fun events, friendly competitions, social gatherings, and generous donations of time and money. Some of the best events were Jacks Night, Flushing Road Rally, and volunteering for the local Flushing Historical Society. Together we were able to raise an outstanding \$3,564, which was split with the winning Derby Days team and donated to the Huntsman Cancer Institute (HCI). Jon M. Huntsman (Penn. 1959) is the Sigma Chi brother who invested \$300 million to establish the Huntsman Cancer Institute in 1995. Brother Huntsman has made it his life's work to eradicate cancer. He has committed that 100% of your donations will be used to fund groundbreaking cancer research. We are pleased to be able to donate \$2,633, nearly double our Derby Days contribution from last year, and will continue to offer our time and money to help the amazing cause.
